I believe that it will be an important historical monument for the posterity and a great present help of perennial value to Catholic scholars, teachers, priests, seminarians and students to put on the Internet in digital form big classical Catholic works in the sacred Latin and Greek languages. The Holy Father desires that the sacred language of the Catholic Church that is Latin be learned by Catholics and especially by priests and seminarians. How are they going to learn Latin if there are no books in Latin on sale or if they are very expensive and difficult to obtain?

This year the "Corpus Thomisticum", or the complete works of Saint Thomas of Aquinas, Doctor Angelicus, was made available in digital form on the internet:

In collaboration with IBM and Cael. Dr. Enrique Alarcón Moreno is well-disposed to capably and gracefully collaborate with my proposal.

The Catholic works which would be very good to place on the Internet with free access are:

- 1) Patrologia Latina by J.P. Migne consisting of 221 volumes. These Catholic works have already been digitalized by Chadwyck-Healey in UK, but there is no free access to them. Only the scholars of Harvard University, University of Chicago and some other organizations have an access to them with a password.**
- 2) Acta Sanctorum by the Bollandists consisting of 61 very large volumes of the lives of Saints. Again these works have been digitalized by Chadwyck-Healey but there is no free access to them on the Internet.**
- 3) Acta Conciliorum – Ecumenical and General Church Councils by Mansi.**
- 4) Commentarium in Universam Sacram Scripturam by Cornelio a Lapide, S.J., (1567-1637), commentary on the Holy Writ**

recommended by many Saints and Pope Paul VI.

5) **Greek Fathers by J.P. Migne**

6) **Annales Ecclesiastici a Christi nato ad annum 1198.** 12 big volumes about the history of the Catholic Church by the Venerable Cardinal Cesare Baronio (1538-1607), Vatican librarian and confessor of His Holiness Clement Pp. VIII. It is history of the Catholic Church and defence of the Papacy based on authentic historical documents.

7) **Bullarium Romanum. The Papal Bulls.**

I would also like to suggest that K of C distribute as a gift, in addition to the Holy


